## The Formal Paragraph

- 1. Topic sentence: introduces the title of the work you are writing about, the author, and gives an idea of the topic to be discussed. (Title and author are for literary paragraphs).
- 2. Thesis: states clearly the 3 specific points of your argument or topic. This should be done in one sentence. For example:

People should never drink and drive because of 1, 2, and 3.

- 3. Point #1 is now made with a TRANSITION.
- 4. Example #1 (such as a direct quote) supports your point.
- 5. Explanation #1 of (what the significance of the quote is) why does your example prove your point?
- 6. TRANSITION to Point #2.
- 7. Example #2
- 8. Explanation for the quote #2.
- 9. TRANSITION to Point #3.
- 10. Example #3
- 11. Explanation for the quote #3.
- 12. Conclude by restating your thesis sentence.

Reminders:

- -All the points are addressed in the order shown in the thesis.
- -Write in PRESENT TENSE if it is a literary paragraph.
- -Avoid contractions (didn't, wasn't, etc).

-Never use YOU

- -Avoid I unless it is specifically an opinion piece.
- -Write out numbers under 100.
- -Use ink and double space
